She moved to New York City in 1996 and here she has been able to focus on her true passion: product design.

Mariana comes out to meet us and moves about her little kingdom like a princess. She shows us some pieces from her collection; they're very simple but at the same time extraordinarily beautiful.

She opened this shop only a few months ago and it has already become a mecca for women who love Italian fashion. The boutique focuses on small Italian companies, which provide the world with meticulously crafted, creative, and innovative products.

"I was tired of doing shows and carrying around these pieces. I said to myself: I'm ready to open a boutique; these things are not easily found. I want it to be original and I want all Italian things." Thanks to friendships formed over the years and during her travels throughout Italy, Antinori is able to gather objects that are hard to find.
